Adjournment came at 8:10pm.



"Cars" were wondering why there was a car named Doc Hudson. They had probably never seen or heard of such a vehicle. This was not a shock to those of us who grew up in the car culture of the 19-50's, when the Hudson was a major brand with a good reputation.

The demise of Hudson was one of the sad byproducts of the struggle for supremacy among the major auto manufacturers in the 50's.



Hudson had a long history as a top competitor in the industry and after WW2 they claimed a big engineering advantage with the introduction of the 'step-down' chassis which lowered the body for better aerodynamics and handling.

This resulted in Hudson dominating NASCAR in the early 50's. It still holds the record for most consecutive wins by one manufacturer.



However, they couldn't keep up with the constant re-design and marketing muscle of the Big Three and low sales forced them to merge with Nash and become American Motors. Noted car guy *Jay Leno* thinks they were doomed by their inability to develop a V-8 engine to compete in the horsepower wars of that era.








