Woody (or Woodie?)



Growing up in the Midwest in the 19-50's & 60's you couldn't help but feel you weren't cool. Oh, I was plenty cool shoveling snow off my driveway in the winter, but that was the wrong

kind of cool. My transistor radio was constantly reminding me that the really 'cool' kids were hopping in their woody van heading to the beach with their surfboards on top and bikini-clad girlfriends in back. Envious doesn't begin to

describe my emotions. It did spark a life-long fascination with the vehicle that powered this teenage fantasy, so when I ran across an old Revell woody kit at the last Jaxcon, I had to





give it a try. My research revealed an interesting history of the cars and trucks that used wood as a prominent part of their structure.

They started as just a utilitarian wooden box on a metal frame and progressed to become considered the height of luxury in the 19-30's but disappeared not long after WW2. What happened?



Like most sudden departures it came down to simple economics. Building a woody is labor intensive and requires highly skilled craftsmen. It was not suited to a mass production

environment.



There's also the little problem of maintenance and upkeep. If you parked your woody outside you had to strip and refinish the wood every year or it would end up looking like this example. Even under the best conditions it took a lot of work to keep it in good shape.



That's why so many ended up in California junkyards waiting for some surfer dude to come rescue it and begin a new life.
















